OPERATIONS

1. **Financial** - EIPDLA Bank Accounts

The E.I.P.D.L.A shall operate three bank accounts as follows

- Chequing Account – Active Season Account
- Chequing/Savings Account – Surplus Account
- Chequing Account – Snoflake

1.1 All surplus monies from the Active Season shall as soon as practical, at the end of the financial season, be transferred to the Surplus Account. Such funds to be used as the Executive Officers Committee sees fit.

1.2 Signing Authority

The bank shall be instructed to perform any transactions bearing the signatures of any two of three officials of the Executive Officers Committee, one of which must be that of the Treasurer.

2. **League Structure**

The league will consist of divisions as dictated by local registration not exceed 12 teams per division. Each team will contain a minimum of six and a maximum of 12 fully paid up members. All members must be paid up before they play or they do not play. Teams must have a least one member of the opposite gender playing each night. Each team shall have a captain and an assistant captain.

2.1 Membership

Pubs must provide suitable facilities as outlined in the General Requirements attached to the General Rules of Play.

2.2 Teams must register and pay for a minimum of six (6) players on registration night. You may register up to twelve (12) players per team. Teams registering players after registration night must submit, with their score sheet for the night, the player's name, address, phone number and postal code. The required registration fee shall be handed to the Treasurer at the next Captain's meeting.

3. **Responsibilities**

3.1 Captains Duties

1. The Captain is responsible for the conduct of his or her team.
2. The Captain must ensure that all player fees, pub fees, fines, banquet fees, or any other monies are collected in the time frame allotted and turned over to the member of the Executive Officers Committee assigned to collect such monies.
3. The Captain must make every reasonable attempt to ensure he has all the necessary information relevant to meetings, rules, schedules and procedures. The Captain is responsible for keeping his team informed of play dates, place of play and ensuring that his team turns out for play. He is also responsible for the distribution of all information received by way of meetings or other such notice to his players.
4. Captains are responsible for attending meetings or appoint a representative from his team to attend in his absence. The captain is solely responsible for obtaining all information on business conducted at any meetings for which they were absent.
5. Captains are responsible for the completeness and accuracy of the score sheet, including transferring information from the back of the score sheet onto the front and to see that it is turned into the appropriate person when required to do so, and no later than the end of regular season play. Failure to do so will result in fines for not submitting score sheets. You also may be prohibited from participating in any Playoff Schedule including the Knockout Cup

6. If a Captain disregards his duties to a point where he creates disharmony or impedes the established procedure of the League, the Executive Officers Committee shall have the authority to ask the team to choose another Captain.

3.2 Assistant Captains
Each team must have an Assistant Captain and his duties will be set out as for the Captain's.

4. League Awards

League trophies will be awarded as follows:

4.1 Team Trophies
Team trophies shall be awarded to all teams in the regular season.

4.2 Playoff Trophies
Team trophies will be awarded to the teams finishing 1st through 3rd based on the number of eligible players per team.

4.3 Individual Awards
Individual awards will be presented per division in the following categories attained in the regular season:

High Score	For scores 141 or greater
High Finishes	For finishes 100 or greater
Most Single Wins	As a % of games played. Must have played 75% or more games to qualify in winter play and 70% in summer play
Century Club	For 100 or more Tons
Half-Century Club	For 50 or more tons in the summer season
180s	For attaining a perfect score. These will accumulate through playoffs and noted in all League events and accumulated.

4.5 Other Awards
An award will be presented to the person(s) attaining a 170 finish. A keeper trophy for the individual(s) attaining such a finish will also be awarded.
A person through player nomination on the score sheet that has been deemed to be the Most Sportsmanlike Player will receive the Rick Noddings' Memorial Sportsmanlike Player Award.

4.6 League Tournament Trophies
Individual or Team trophies as the case may be will be awarded first (1st) through joint third (3rd) in the following tournaments:

- Mixed Doubles
- League Open Doubles
- League Singles (men/ladies)

5 Playoffs

5.1 Playoffs

Split into A – B or A – B – C pool provided the amount of teams coincides with the format. In the event there are fewer teams than this format will allow (specifically summer) then a straight knockout format will be used.

6. Tournaments

In all tournaments organized by, or held under the auspices of the EIPDLA, entry fees, prize money, trophies and entry qualifications shall be as advertised. All singles, double, mixed and team playoffs within the League shall be considered as tournaments.

6.1 Singles Competition

Open to all paid up members of the EIPDLA. They will be eligible to compete for the single championship. Date, time and place to be set by the Drawmaster. Method of play to be determined at the event by the Drawmaster based on number of entrants.

6.2 Doubles Competition

Open to all paid up members of the EIPDLA. They will be eligible to compete for the double championship. Date, time and place to be set by the Drawmaster. Method of play to be determined at the event by the Drawmaster based on number of entrants.

6.3 Mixed Doubles

Participation is open to 1 male/1 female teams, one of which must be a member in good standing of the EIPDLA, the other need not be a member. Date, time and place to be set by the Drawmaster. Method of play to be determined at the event by the Drawmaster based on number of entrants.

7. Changes

7.1 Operation changes may be made by the Executive Officers Committee at their discretion to effectively handle the day to day operations of the Associations. A copy of the changes or revisions will be distributed to all captains as soon as practical.

7.2 Rule of Play changes must be presented in writing to the Executive Officers Committee prior to any Captain's Meeting in sufficient time for the Executive Officers Committee to review and include on the Agenda. The proposal will be discussed at the meeting in which it was presented and may be voted on at that meeting. A change will be passed by a majority of members present at such meeting. A vote will be by show of hands. No proxies will be allowed.

8. Intent

Operations and Rules of Play are not intended to be part of the by-laws of the Edmonton Inter Pub Dart League Association.

9. Summer League

Each summer a league will be held if no less than 6 full teams are registered in full (see rule 2.2). If fewer than 6 teams are available, the format will be at the discretion of the league members and executive who are available to participate during the season.

10. Captains Meetings

Other than the first captains meeting of a dart session, all captains meetings will be held on Sundays except where a meeting is not possible due to conflicting schedules.
