The marginal note "Aff" which frequently occurs in the Subsidy Rolls of this period refers to affidavit made by the collector that the person assessed could not be found or that he had no chattels.

Records from Canterbury found in London Walloon Church in an old carved box in the roof – "The Old London Church of Threadneedle St".

1679 – An act for burying in Woollen – to encourage woolen and paper manufacturers. An affidavit had to be produced within 8 days of burial certified that the deceased was not buried in linen – if no affidavit made, it is often mentioned that the body was wrapped in linen, when a fine was imposed and devoted usually to the necessities of the poor (indication of family of deceased was more affluent).

Vol 8-9 – The Registers of the French Church, Threadneedle Street

Preface: London Threadneedle St Church, the mother church of the Walloon and French congregations and first used by the French speaking refugees in 1550, the chapel and sacristy of the hospital of St Anthony having been granted to them by the Dean and Canons of Windsor on the 16 October 1550.

Registers of the church well preserved. Registrar generals department in Somerset House. Reference f- Foreign Churches, 17, I-XIII, 1600-1753.

Up to the year 1664, London had been divided by the Consistory into four quarters for administrative purposes connected with the visitation of the sick and poor. In this year (1664), James Street was detached to form a fifth quarter with the Hospital as we are informed by M le Baron de Schickler.

Temoignage – or attestation - to enable the applicant to join another church.

Re: Letters Patent – 1688

Gave a general licence to an incorporated body of French Ministers with Perpetual succession to hire rooms, acquire land, build churches and exercise their peculiar form of ecclesiastical discipline within the city of London and the suburbs of the same.

J.S. Burn (author History of the French, Walloon, Dutch and other Foreign Protestant Refugees in England, 1846). Registers, but also other records of the church no unfortunately no longer to be found tells us that the congregation met first in Glovers Hall (Ogilby and Morgans map of 1677). Map has been reproduced by the London and Middlesex Archaeological Society 1894-95. And two entries among the marriages (Aug 25 and Oct 13, 1689) bear out this statement. This hall, in which some of the synods of the French churches are said to have been held, stood in Glover's Hall Court, on the south side of Beech Lane, in Cripplegate Ward Without. Beech Lane still exists, connecting White and Red Cross Streets. Aug 21, 1707, (heading on 3rd Vol of registers) congregation now meets in Paternoster Row (lies immediately south of Spitalfields Market).

1716 – A lease of a chapel in Crispin Street was taken for 32 years. Crispin Street runs north and south, on the west side of Spitalfields Market, the.....of the district.

Stow's Survey: ed. 1720 Book IV p. 48. This map shows in addition two other French Churches, one in St John Street and one in Black Eagle Street. The latter of these was, no doubt, the building called in the 1755 edition, the French Almshouse, and referred to more than once in these Registers as l'Eglise de l'Hopital.

On expiry of this lease, a chapel in Brown's Lane was purchased and the first baptism is noted as having taken place in this building on April 13, 1740. Brown's Lane again is close to Spitalfields Market forming the continuation eastwards of Lamb Street, which is on the north side of the Market. In 1786, our church, together with an adjoining one known as the Artillery was finally merged in the London Walloon Church to which its registers and records seem to have been transferred.

The history of the church of La Patente extends over a period of 97 years – congregation was numerous, yet it did not comprise nearly all the foreigners resident in this district. Within a stone's throw of our church, no less than 10 others. Viz. The Artillery in Parliament Court, Artillery Street (1691-1786).

The Reconnaissances

French Huguenot – must belong to a church, usually admitted through Baptism, or if they came in as an adult, they had to bring with them from the church they were leaving a "temoignage". Impossible often for a Protestant church (in France) being broken. French Church (in England) called these reconnaissances or affirmations (related to those who had suffered persecution in France and under stress of persecution had probably in some degree wavered). Records of these not complete. Eg. Louis XIV – children of Protestant parents were forcibly baptised into "roman" faith and therefore raised in same.

Vol. 11 – 13: List of Street Names and Location (introduction section)
Artillery Ground – the old Artillery Ground, over the site of which Union Street now runs. The name survives in Artillery Lane.

In 1698, it was in parish, Saint Catherine de la Tour. Trades – area trades were of the weaver and textile related. Sea faring trades were prominent as many refugees came from the coasts of Normandy and Bay of Biscay. Weavers were of a poorer class in France and so coming to London settled in Spitalfields as finding it a cheap neighbourhood.

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Notes: Protection was one of the chief needs of the Reformed Churches. They had to see that none were admitted to membership who did not bring with them some guarantee that they were of faith; for in the early days in France the danger from spies and informers was great; and secondly, the maintenance of the true faith demanded an assurance that every candidate for admission held faith in all its purity. To ensure these ends no candidate was admitted a member of any congregation unless he brought with him a Temoignage. In its simplest form, the temoignage was a certificate from the church from which the postulant came but under the stress of immigration, such a tem. was impossible, and the necessary assurance that the candidate was worthy of acceptance took many different forms all of which gallerien, sortid des galleres or confesseur: those who had suffered persecution were welcomed as a martyr.

More usual, is the temoignage brought from the church of which the candidate has been a member. This would be given either by its consistoire or by some Minister, ancien or diacre. (er. Par temoignage de Niort or de M. Metaye, Minister de St Quentin) If member left hastily, he or she may be vouched or sponsored by an existing member of the church personal temoignage or the statement connu, connu de diacres or reconnu de nos vieux membres Case enquiry where minister would enquire to get credentials. Temoignage de M. Guespin que s'on est enquis Direct conversion from RC Church or perhaps some forced lapse thereto: a fait abjuration de la religion Romaine et a ete admis membre de cette elgise or (par abjuration) or (recu sur la reconnaissance qu'il a fit).Un Membre (own testimony and sponsorship) par son temoignage meme or lui meme Or n'a pas ete recu Readmitted – of those settled in England, many were drawn away from the church they had joined by exigincies of work. No doubt they took a temoignage with them and when as sometimes chanced, some of these wanderers returned they were described as: rapporte son temoignage; readmis membre; readmis apres un voyage or par temoignage rehabilitiee, ayont negligé son billet, membre dechu est retable sure le pied d'etranger.By natural increase (offspring). Children were admitted coming of age and as in confirmation entries include name, age, birthplace, with often parents name added. Parent or some relation appears to introduce the child.

Court books recorded the proceedings at the frequent meetings but notably for the binding of apprentices and the admission of new members, whether as journeyman or masters. Until 1730, not complete records. Weaver's Co in Basinghall Street. London weavers greeted refugee weavers more kindly. Membership of either church (French or Dutch), accompanied by guaranties of proper qualification acquired here or abroad was a sure passport into the guild for both master or journeyman. Admission of an alien by money payment.

Silk trade suffered from fluctuating fortunes. Interruptions of supply of raw materials, fashion changes, foreign competition + smuggling. Poverty among weavers was never about Irish weavers and labour accepted lower wages.

Portion: 8oz dry bread, 4 oz of bread in the soup, ½ lb meat. In most cases 3 portions a week were provided; less often 4 portions were issued and there were instances where 6 were given for a time.

Sept 1739 – March 1740: was one of the hardest winters of the century “when coaches plied upon the Thames”; the frost lasted nine weeks from Christmas to the end of February.

Alehouses frequently owned by weavers.1732: 44 licencees in the parish of Christchurch emphasizes unhappy social conditions – also is a meeting place. No house #'s but reference to the closest alehouse. For 3 centuries Spitalfields has been a place where the refugee has found shelter worked hard and eventually moved on to be followed by others. Christ Church – restored.
