**EX PARTE ORDER
REQUIRING DEBTOR
TO SUBMIT TO EXAMINATION AND PRODUCE DOCUMENTS
WITHOUT DEBTOR'S CONSENT UNDER F.R.B.P. 2004,
AND EXTENDING TIME PERIODS TO OBJECT TO DISCHARGE
AND FOR FILING A DISMISSAL MOTION**

The Court having reviewed the United States Trustee's "Ex Parte Application for an Order Requiring Debtor to Submit to Examination and Produce Documents Without debtors' Consent Under F.R.B.P. 2004, and Extending Time Periods to Object to Discharge and for Filing a Dismissal Motion," and determined that the relief requested should be granted; now, therefore,

IT IS ORDERED that the Debtor shall appear at the Federal Building, U.S. Courthouse, Room 111, 410 W. Michigan Avenue, Kalamazoo, Michigan 49007, on December 14, 2011, at 12:00 p.m. (Noon) EST to submit to examination under oath and provide the U.S. Trustee with copies of the following documents by that date and time at that place:

a) The Debtor's pay stubs, or other advices of payment of income of any sort, and any unemployment, disability payment, and workers' compensation statement for the time periods from January 1, 2010 to date (if not readily available, the Debtor may submit a "year-to-date"

compilation if provided by the income source);

b) The Debtor's 2009 and 2010 business and personal federal and state income tax returns, including all schedules, attachments, and W-2 statements;

c) All checkbook registers and statements for any bank, financial, or other investment account(s) in the Debtor's or Debtor's business' name or in which the Debtor had an ownership or financial interest, or which reflect the Debtor's transactions at any time during the period January 1, 2010, to date;

d) All documents in his possession related to, or that explain, the purchase or sale of any and all electronics, computers, remote control planes and helicopters, and ham radio and equipment owned by the Debtor at any time during from January 1, 2007 to the date of the examination; and

e) All business records in his possession related to, or that explain, any vehicle or transmission repair business or work contracted or performed by the Debtor from January 1, 2010 to the date of the examination.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the time to object to the Debtor's discharge under 11 U.S.C. Section 727, and to file a motion to dismiss under 11 U.S.C. Section 707, for both the case Trustee (currently Thomas R. Tibble) and the U.S. Trustee is **extended to January 15, 2012**, and the Court Clerk is directed not to grant the Debtor's discharge until after such date.


