

What to do if you find a cat or kittens - follow this chart (Dee's Orphan Kitten Fund recommendations only)

start

Is this a cat or a bunch of little kittens?

Cat

Kittens

If these kittens are outside, gather them up. For example, if they are in your compost bin, or in a wood pile. Do this even if they are very small. Keep an eye out for Momcat.

Call Dee's Orphan Kitten Fund immediately. **250.896.5771**

Keep the kittens warm, dry and in a safe place until Dee's or a Vet can help.

Does the cat seem in distress in any way e.g. injured, breathing heavy, stressed
Is the cat in an unsafe situation right now - e.g. in imminent danger

Yes

Call the Victoria SPCA - they care for cats in this situation, from all municipalities - **250.388.7722**

No

Is the cat tame or - e.g. can you touch the cat

Yes

Look for a collar, or ID tattoo. ID Tattoos are found in the right ear

If a collar, look for any information that will help

If there is a tattoo, call any veterinary clinic, and they will help

Yes

Put a collar on the cat, with a note asking is this your cat etc

Keep an eye on it, feed it if there for more than a few days
