Don E. Saliers is recently retired Professor of Theology and Worship and Director of the Master of Sacred Music program at the Candler School of Theology, Emory University in Atlanta, Georgia. An ordained United Methodist minister and an accomplished organist, his keen insight, ability to communicate effectively and passion to renew worship make him a sought-after speaker at worship conferences across the continent. Don has authored, co-authored, or edited some fourteen books on music, worship, spirituality, and theology, including *Music and Theology: Horizons in Theology; Worship and Spirituality; The Conversation Matters; Soul in Paraphrase: Prayer and Religious Affections; Worship as Theology: Foretaste of Glory Divine; Worship Come to Its Senses; Christian Spirituality: Post Reformation and Modern; Human Disability and the Service of God; and A Song to Sing, a Life to Live: Reflections on Music as Spiritual Practice.*



Doug Gay is Lecturer in Practical Theology at the University of Glasgow and an associate member of the Iona Community. An ordained minister, he has spent eight years in pastoral ministry, six of these in inner city London. Doug is a singer/songwriter who was part of a 90s indy rock band *Calvin's Dream*, and he has also written a number of hymns and worship songs. His engaging and creative approach to worship leading combines evangelical and catholic instincts. Doug has led worship at a number of large gatherings in the UK, including the Jesus in the City Urban Congress and Greenbelt Christian Arts Festival. He is one of the UK pioneers of "alternative worship" and has a keen interest in conversations around "Emerging Church". He has recently co-authored a book entitled *Alternative Worship: Resources from and for the Emerging Church* and is currently finishing a book called *The Church Emerging*.
