JONASSON DENIES HAVING SEX WITH STONE

WINNIPEG, MANITOBA (CRAP: Canadian Regional Associated Press) – Amidst rumors of scandal, which could potentially damage his campaign to become governor of California, Stefan Jonasson vehemently denied any romantic involvement with actress Sharon Stone. “She’s just an imaginary friend,” he was reported as saying in response to allegations that he had overreacted in his recent criticism of Arnold Schwarzenegger, whom he accused of minimizing Stone’s role in the 1990 movie *Total Recall*. Some commentators have suggested that Jonasson’s sensitivity over the perceived slight stems from an intimate relationship between him and Schwarzenegger’s former co-star.

However, an investigative reporter revealed that Jonasson, an ordained minister, preached at a church in Stone’s hometown of Meadville, Pennsylvania, in 1992. Although Stone left that community around 1976 to pursue her acting career, the fact that the gubernatorial candidate and the actress were present in Meadville within 16 years of one another has led some to speculate that Jonasson is not being forthright about their relationship. The discovery of at least one compromising photograph has done nothing to diminish suspicions.



Despite repeated denials of a romantic relationship, a photograph has surfaced which allegedly shows actress Sharon Stone and gubernatorial candidate Stefan Jonasson frolicking together in the waves near a luxury lakeside retreat belonging to the candidate’s brother.

Even so, the candidate angrily swept aside any suggestion of a secret tryst. “I did not have sexual relations with that woman ... Ms. Stone,” was his terse response before abruptly leaving a news conference. But doubts remain

and campaign organizers are clearly worried that these allegations may continue to dog the candidate between now and election day.

Responding to accusations that Jonasson seems to be trading cabinet appointments for personal favors, a campaign spokesperson insisted, "Ms. Stone has not been offered a position in the state cabinet. She has an IQ of 156 – she's obviously far too smart to get involved in politics." But Hollywood insiders have been left wondering whether she's too smart to get involved with the charismatic Canadian minister seeking California's highest elected office, while political analysts are wondering whether Jonasson is still serious about naming Tom Hanks as the state's First Lady, should he become governor.
