

if they achieved a minimum GPA of 2.0, or to probationary status if the GPA is less than 2.0. They must fulfill the Academic Writing Requirement within the first term of study.

Home-schooled students who are 21 years of age or older may also be considered for admission as Mature Students.

Students admitted as Home Schooled students are ineligible for Academic Entrance Scholarships, but they may be eligible for a Leadership Entrance Scholarship or one of the Merit Awards in the areas of music, athletics or church & community service, and bursaries. After completing a year at CMU, they are eligible for all returning student scholarships and bursaries.

CMU'S OUTTATOWN DISCIPLESHIP SCHOOL

Not everyone is ready to begin university studies right out of high school studies. Some may want to take a year to see a new part of the world and figure out what they want to do with their lives. Through Outtatown, CMU's eight-month adventure and discipleship program, students can learn more about themselves, about God and about the world through studies in western Canada and Guatemala or South Africa. Students who complete the Outtatown program may earn up to 18 course credit hours which can be transferred to programs at CMU.

HOME SCHOOLED STUDENT GUIDELINES

Students who are under 21 years of age and have not, or will not, receive a certificate of graduation through a public or an accredited private secondary school system, may apply for admission under one of the following two options:

1. Students who have successfully completed a provincial secondary school study program must submit a final mark statement and a graduation certificate from the Department of Education of their home province to demonstrate that they meet CMU's regular admission requirements.
2. Students who have been home-schooled on a private basis must submit a written declaration or transcript prepared by the primary educator outlining the secondary level courses completed, the type of program, material used, and the length of the program. To be eligible for consideration, such students must have achieved a minimum of 60% or "C" grade average.

After students have completed a minimum of eighteen credit hours of coursework, or at the end of the first academic year, whichever occurs first, they will be evaluated in accordance with CMU's academic performance policy and their status will be changed to regular status
