



Measuring the Height of Your Terrier

1. The terrier should be standing on a rigid, flat and even surface.
2. The terrier should be standing squarely in a natural upright position. The terrier's head and neck should not either be pulled up, or pushed down, nor should the terrier's front or back legs be pulled or pushed inward.
3. The wicket should be placed at the top of the scapula (**the highest point of the shoulder blade**). Slight pressure should be applied to the top of the wicket, but only to hold it in place.
4. The terrier's front legs must be perpendicular to the ground, and the legs of the wicket must be parallel to the terrier's front legs.
5. All four pads must be touching the measuring surface.
